Critical Time Intervention (CTI) An Intensive, Instructor-Led Online Course

Critical Time Intervention (CTI) is a focused, time-limited approach to case management that is designed to connect people with community supports as they transition into housing from homelessness or institutional settings such as prisons and hospitals.

CTI is an evidence-based practice shown to be especially effective for individuals with a serious mental illness. The CTI model has also been adapted to support other populations, including families, women experiencing chronic homelessness, and individuals living with HIV. CTI is now recognized across the United States and internationally as a cutting-edge case management model.

What to Expect from the Course

This course will give your agency all the tools it needs to implement CTI. We bring together national CTI experts, a team-based learning approach, and engaging multimedia technology. The course covers CTI principles, evidence for CTI, phases of CTI, and skills for implementation.

The course includes weekly online meetings for a total of 8 weeks.

In addition to these live instructor-led sessions, participants will complete self-paced modules, background reading, and course activities. They will also have access to national experts, facilitators and other participants through online discussion forums. The course is intensive, requiring commitment from the staff and the agency leadership. When your team completes the course, you'll be ready to implement CTI in your agency.

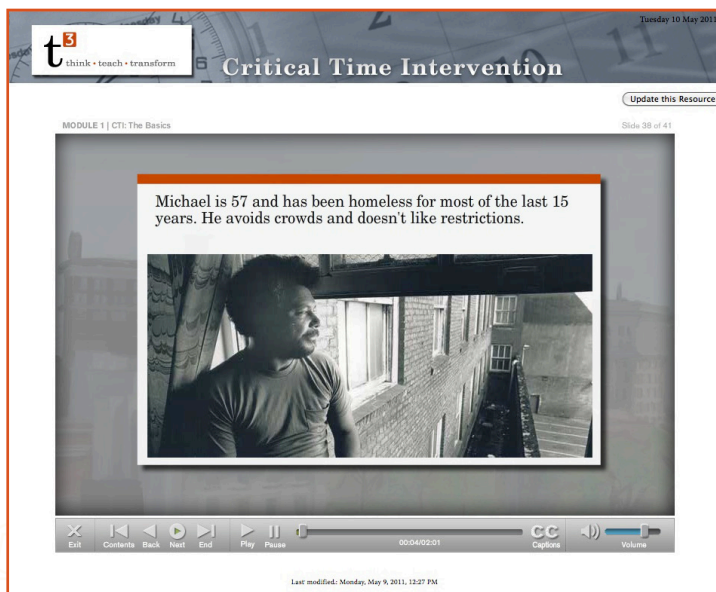
